JUNE - PATIENCE

In our contemporary times the word **PATIENCE** is typically identified " by not having much" or "losing it " rather quickly. From a worldy perspective this seems quite natural as we are quick to defend ourselves when offended, get frustrated when our food orders are wrong; lose our cool when our online orders don't arrive on time. We lose our PATIENCE at our spouses' lateness, our children's poor decisions, our friends lack of empathy and compassion. Triggers abound in our culture that can make us lose our PATIENCE: racism, sexism, colorism, police brutality, unfair pay, the inability to find a job, etc. And yes, we are justified in having a righteous indignation towards any injustice. But, along with showing indignation one of the real tests of character and I would argue even our faith is having and showing true PATIENCE in the wake of injustice and personal offense.

The Hebrew word for PATIENCE is savlanut. The root of the word s-v-l means "to bear" or "to suffer". The Greek word is hupomone for PATIENCE. It is similar in meaning to savlanut as it means "to endure". It's connotation is to endure or bear up under suffering. But the beauty of the suffering, if such beauty exists, is tethered or anchored to a promise from God.

True PATIENCE, as a fruit of the Spirit must be developed as it doesn't always come naturally but it also looks to the future. The future that contains the hope of a promised end that comes from God. Whether it be the ability to just not lose control on those around us; to walk and live in empathy with those that offend and try to understand that they are human, like we. Or if it is bearing up against sickness and enduring injustice, while fighting still for justice; longing for empathy, and desiring self-control, PATIENCE is a Godly virtue that we all need and must have to be faithful servants of God. One final beautiful connotation of PATIENCE also means "to wait" but this isn't a static or idle waiting. It doesn't mean sitting silently on the sidelines waiting our turn. No! It means waiting, actively. It means serving God and His people and in serving, PATIENCE begins to work developing the character of Christ in us. His character makes us more steadfast, longsuffering, kind and peaceful. Let PATIENCE have her perfect work in you today! To God Be The Glory!
